

Keeping Our Community Safe

Keeping our community safe is our collective responsibility. In an effort to promote community safety, if you find discarded needles, and other drug paraphernalia, please see the below instructions on how best to dispose of it safely:

- Treat all needles and paraphernalia as contaminated;
- Find a sharps container or a thick plastic container with a secure lid. Do not use a thin plastic container that a needed could pierce. Do not use a glass container because it could break;
- You can contact your local pharmacy to see if they offer free sharps container and disposal. Sharps container are available at the Renfrew County and District Health Unit;
- Remove the lid and place the container on a stable surface next to the needle;
- Wear gloves (i.e. latex, rubber or leather gardening gloves). Gloves are meant to protect against fluid contamination, not punctures or cuts);
- Do not re-cap the needle;
- Use tongs, pliers or tweezers to pick up the needle. Be sure to clean and disinfect the pickup instrument afterwards;
- Pick up the needle by the plastic end (syringe);
- Point the needle tip away from your body. Be very careful not to poke yourself with the needle;
- Do not hold the container in your hand while placing the needle inside;
- Place the needle point down into the container. Do not force the needle into the container;
- Tightly seal the container;
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after removal of gloves;
- Find the nearest needle disposal location. Do not put items in the garbage or recycling bin.

If someone has been poked or scratch by a needle, seek immediate medical attention. ***IMPORTANT:** If you have picked up used needles or other drug paraphernalia in your neighbourhood, please report these finds to the Renfrew County and District Health Unit at harmreduction@rcdhu.com with the following info: Your name/contact info, what was found, how many and the exact or closest address to the pickup location.

Waste Sites - Summer Hours Schedule

All residents may use ANY of the Township Wastes/Transfer Sites to recycle your materials and dispose of your waste. Bulky Waste and Construction materials must be taken to <u>Sno Drifters</u>. The Sno Drifters site can be opened on a callin basis as long as staff are in the area and the opening fee is \$40. Please note: Summer hours in the schedule below start on May 21, 2022 until Thanksgiving Weekend, 2022. The Hazardous Waste Depot at Sand Road Waste Site will also be open Saturdays ONLY May 21, 2022 until September 24, 2022. However, the Sno Drifters site will begin the Mondays to Thursdays beginning Tuesday May 24, 2022 to Thursday August 25, 2022.

The new Zoning By-law will provide a comprehensive regulatory framework for land use planning and development within the Township. Furthermore all animals shall be leashed not to exceed two (2) meters in length and be capable of controlling an animal from annoying, bothering or irritating persons or other animals.
