Notice of Public Meeting

A public meeting to inform the public of the proposed zoning amendment will be held on <u>Tuesday, February 16,</u> <u>2021</u> via zoom conferencing at <u>3:30 p.m.</u>

The By-law affects all lands within the Township of Bonnechere Valley. The purpose and effect of this application is to update the existing definitions for trailers and recreational vehicles. In addition the proposed zoning amendment would change the land use provisions of the Limited Service Residential – Exception One (LSR-E1), Limited Service Residential – Exception Two (LSR-E2), Rural Residential (RR), Rural (RU) and Residential Four (R4) Zones to permit a trailer/recreational vehicle to be used for accommodation.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Bonnechere Valley before the by-law is

passed, by the Township, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Township of Bonnechere Valley, to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal.

Please ensure to wear a face mask. Appointments are encouraged for discussions on planning and building matters as well as obtaining a marriage licence. You can still make payments on water or tax accounts, by using online or telephone baking, mailing a cheque to the Township of Bonnechere Valley or dropping a payment off in the secure mail slot located at the office.

Eganville's Outdoor Rink

As the weather gets colder, exercise and mental health remain a priority. You may want to take advantage of the outdoor rink in Eganville's Centennial Park as it will remain open depending on weather conditions and social distancing protocols are in effect.

This includes only having close contact with people in your household or essential supports, staving a safe distance of two metres (six feet) from others, wearing a face covering and staying home if you are ill and getting tested if you have symptoms of COVID-19.

Maximum of 25 people and no hockey or other team sports will be permitted on the Outdoor Rink.

Reminder to Dog Owners

Licensing your dog is their ticket home. It provides Animal & Bylaw Services with the information that is needed to reunite you with your dog.

Beginning in January, a new dog tag (license) must be obtained by March 31st. Dog tags can be purchased for \$20 at the municipal office (49 Bonnechere Street East) from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.


