

# Voters Have Had Their Say at the Polls

Ontario voters have had their say in the municipal elections across the province on October 22, 2018. In Bonnechere Valley we saw a voter turn out of 47.5% or 1972 ballots of 4,151 eligible voters. We would like to congratulate all candidates for putting their names forward to serve the wonderful residents in our community.

Acclaimed members Mayor Jennifer Murphy and Councillor Merv Buckwald will be joined around the table by newly elected members Brent Patrick, Jack Roesner and Tim Schison. This team will work together to continue to move the Township forward. Congratulations to all on running excellent races!

Election Results are as follows:

Jackie Agnew (Ward 1) - 219 votes Brent Patrick (Ward 1) - 288 votes

Meredith Jamieson (Ward 2) - 356 votes Tim Schison (Ward 2) - 402 votes

Val Collins (Ward 3) - 192 votes Jack Roesner (Ward 3) - 277 votes



Council authorized the clerk who is responsible for conducting the 2018 election to place the following referendum on the ballot. "Are you in favour of The Corporation of the Township of Bonnechere Valley passing a by-law so that all councilors, including the Mayor, are elected by general vote instead of the current system of voting?".

Results on this question were **Yes - 948 votes and No - 570 votes**. However, we needed a voter turnout of 51% in order for the question to be Council binding. Since we only saw voter turn out of 47.5% this question is not Council binding.

#### The Do's and Do Not's of Cannabis

Recreational cannabis was legalized on October 17, 2018 by the Federal Government. Ontario's Government for the People has put rules in place to keep cannabis out the hands of children and youth, keep our roads safe and combat the illegal market. You must be 19 and older to buy, use, possess and grow recreational cannabis. This is the same as the minimum age for the sale of tobacco and alcohol in Ontario.

The government has enacted the following rules for using cannabis, both medical and recreational. Where you can smoke and vape cannabis: Private residences - this does not include residences that are also workplaces (e.g. long-term care and/or retirement homes), Many outdoor public places (e.g. sidewalks, parks), Designated guest rooms in hotels, motels and inns, Residential vehicles and boats that meet certain criteria (e.g. have permanent sleeping accommodations and cooking facilities, and are parked or anchored), Controlled areas in: long-term care homes, certain retirement homes, residential hospices, provincially-funded supportive housing, designated psychiatric facilities or veterans' facilities.



You CANNOT smoke or vape cannabis in: indoor common areas in condos, apartment buildings and university/college residences, enclosed public places and enclosed work place, non-designated guest rooms in hotels, motels and inns, schools and places where children gather (this includes at school, on school grounds, and all public areas within 20m of these grounds, on children's playgrounds and public areas within 20m of playgrounds, in child care centres, or where an early years program is provided, in places here home child care is provided - even if children aren't present), within the 9m from the entrance of exit of hospitals (public/private), psychiatric facilities, long-term care home, independent health facilities. You cannot smoke or vape cannabis in publicly-owned sport fields (not including golf courses), nearby spectator and public area within 20m of these areas.

## **Property Standards**

For most people Property Standards is a touchy subject. You work hard to keep your property in good repair while others do not seem to care about what their property looks like.

The Township of Bonnechere Valley has a Property Standards Bylaw that is enforced by Municipal Bylaw Enforcement. Most property standards complaints are settled in a matter of days, however the complete process when dealing with a resident or property owner who does not want to comply can take months to resolve.

Once a property standards complaint has been made the timeline is as follows:

- Bylaw Enforcement Visits Property in question, assess the situation and take pictures;
- Bylaw speaks to the resident or owner of the property (If available, otherwise a letter is sent) (Most times a good oldfashioned conversation solves the issue). A visit is followed up with a letter outlining what needs to be done and a timeline for completion);



- Property is cleaned up no further action is required;
- If the Property is not cleaned up within agreed time;
  - Formal warning is issued to resident or property owner with specified time for the property to be cleaned-up.
- Property not cleaned up within specified time;
  - Resident or Property Owner charged under Property Standards Bylaw: or
  - Property issues may be addressed by the Municipality and billed to the resident or owner



If you burn fuels of any kind, and/or have an attached garage at your residence, you must install CO alarms. 
