## Have Your Say At The Polls

The 2018 Ontario Municipal Election will be held on Monday, October 22. To make things easier for citizens of Ontario to ensure they are able to vote in this fall's municipal elections, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) has established a new website called <a href="https://www.voterlookupca.">www.voterlookupca.</a>

If you're a Canadian citizen who is over the age of 18 and are a resident, owner or tenant of property in Ontario, you are eligible to vote in October. Voterlookup.ca will allow Ontarians to ensure they are already on voting rolls and if they aren't, they can also use the site to register. To do so, Ontarians will need to fill out a form which will allow them to see if they are currently on the rolls. The site will also allow them to see if others in their household are also registered to vote as well. Users can also use the site to change their school board support if they wish.

Anyone looking to run for local office needed to have their nomination papers filed by Friday, July 27th at 2 pm at the Municipal Office. In Bonnechere Valley we have two candidates and positions that have been "acclaimed". Jennifer Murphy will be returning to the Council table as the head of Council and this marks Mayor



Murphy's third consecutive term. Councillor Mervin Buckwald is also returning to Bonnechere Valley's table.

#### **School Bells**

September signals the end of summer and the beginning of another school year. As we get back to the rush of our post summer lives be aware of the children and buses that will sprout up along our roadways. Kids getting on and off the busses or walking and riding to school are often single minded and oblivious to the dangers of traffic around them. We need to take the care that they often lack and be ready for sudden and unexpected behaviours. Slow down, put down that cell phone or coffee and keep alert.

REMEMBER: You must not passed a stopped school bus with its upper red lights flashing, no matter which direction you are driving! The fine can be between \$400 and \$2000 with six demerit points and the results far, far worse. Little know fact: If you own a vehicle that passes a school bus with flashing reds you can be fined, even if you are not driving. Make sure anyone who uses your vehicle is aware of the law. If you see a driver breaking this law, you can call 911 if something needs to be done right away or call 1-888-310-1122 or online at www.opp.ca/index.php?id=132. Try to have as much information as possible such as make, colour, model and plate number of the vehicle.



#### For Kids to Know:

\*Be at the bus stop before the bus comes \*Wait in a safe place well back from the edge of the road - don't play in ditches or on snow banks \*Stay out of the DANGER ZONE. If you can touch the bus, you're too close. \*Use 10 giants steps to take you out of the DANGER ZONE, and make sure you and the bus driver can see each other. \*Always cross the road in front of the bus, never behind. \*Look all ways and wait for the driver to signal before you cross in front of a bus. \*Walk at least 10 big steps from the front of the bus. Enter or exit the bus in single file. \*Never push or shove. Walk - never run - across the road. \*NEVER stop to pick up anything that you may have dropped in the DANGER ZONE. Ask an adult or the bus driver to help.

## Working On It

It has been often said that Canada has two seasons; winter and road construction. This year was no different with a number of projects in our municipality. Here is an update:

#### **County Projects:**

Highyway 512 (Foymount Road): The repaving and ditching in the Cormac area is finished with no new paving planned for this year.

Highway 512: The culvert at Hurd's Creek, near Silver Lake Road is nearly complete and may be finished ahead of schedule. The aged steel culver has been replaced with a higher capacity concrete culvert designed to better withstand flash floods. There was to be some paving done between this new culvert and Heideman's mill but due to the extra expense of the temporary bridge and by-pass it has been postponed for now.

Opeongo Road: The Foymount end has been re-surfaced with wider shoulders. Work is complete but beware of some loose gravel until traffic packs it all down.



## Township Projects:

Lake Clear Road: Surface treatment, speed bumps and topsoil on neighbouring properties that were torn up by the reconstruction process are expected to be finished by the end of August unless there is a significant weather delay. Bonnechere Lodge Road: Surface work and other repairs are also to be complete by the end of August.

We know that this sort of work can be inconvenient at times but it is necessary and we hope you understand that our goal is to keep our roads in good shape and safe while spending your tax dollars wisely.




