Bonnechere Valley budget was passed with a 2% increase in the levy however the tax rate has decreased by 1.73%

## **Construction Projects**

Every year we are reminded that there are two seasons in Canada: Winer and Construction. While the work can delay our movement, it is also a point of pride that we take care of our infrastructure and have a long term asset management plan. We use our plan to forecast which roads are in need based on their life cycle, but also use some common sense based on actual wear and tear.

The roads that Bonnechere Valley Works Department will be conducting road construction in the following areas: Bonnechere Lodge Road - 2km; Lake Clear Road - 4.2 km; French Road - 300 m; O'Connor Road - Hill widening and re-aligning; Riverside Street - 150 m of HL3.

The County of Renfrew will be conducting construction on the following: Hwy 51 - Redoing the structure at Silver Lake Road and Hwy 512 Hurds Creek Crossing; Hwy 512 - from cement bridge west of Lake Clear to Cormac.

The Township of Bonnechere Valley has agreed to delay the rehabilitation of Fourth Chute Road until 2019. This decision was made after Bill Kennedy, BV Roads Superintendent, presented to Council that there is an opportunity to apply funding through the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund (OCIF). This is a better option for the rehabilitation of Fourth Chute Road to ensure that it is done once and done right. Fourth Chute is a very busy road for



motorists but is also highly used by cyclists. The widening of this road would work very well for both. The \$238,000 that was budgeted for Fourth Chute in the BV budget will remain in case we are not successful in receiving the grant or to provide the municipal portion that is required by the Province.
