# THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BONNECHERE VALLEY BY-LAW NO. 2017-048

#### **BEING A BY-LAW TO ESTABLISH A HIGHWAY**

**WHEREAS** Section 31 of the Municipal Act, 2001, authorizes the municipality to establish a highway by by-law;

**AND WHEREAS** River Run Ridge is the registered owner of those lands being part of Lot 20, Concession 20, being Part 6, 49R-17936, in the former geographic Township of Grattan;

**AND WHEREAS** Council wishes to establish all of the foregoing lands as part of the public highway known as Wellington Street South;

**AND WHEREAS** it is Council's intention that the municipality shall not assume or otherwise be responsible for the maintenance and repair of the aforesaid highway until such time as Council passes a by-law for that purpose;

### **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**


- 1. Those lands being part of Lot 20, Concession 20 being Part 6, 49R-17936, in the former geographic township of Grattan, now in the Township of Bonnechere Valley, in the County of Renfrew be and are hereby established as a public highway to be known as Wellington Street South.
- Despite the foregoing, the municipality shall not assume or otherwise maintain or be responsible for the maintenance and repair of the lands as part of Wellington Street South unless and until Council passes a by-law expressly assuming responsibility for the maintenance and repair of the lands for that purpose.
- 3. The Clerk shall cause a certified copy of this by-law to be registered against the title to the aforesaid lands.
- 4. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on passing.
