#### **Works Department**

Jason Zohr, Acting Works Superintendent was present and gave his report.

- a) Waste Site Staff Training Waste site staff have had two training sessions that included information on safety, site procedures and record keeping;
- b) Insurance An insurance inspector was on site last week to inspect all Township buildings;
- c) Roadside/Curbside Pick-up Jason Zohr presented Committee with information on extending roadside/curbside pick-up to the entire municipality. Committee gave staff direction to make changes to the draft survey. The survey will be available for to all residents of the Township to complete; and
- d) Load Restrictions The Township will follow the County of Renfrew's load restriction limits and load restrictions will go into effect on March 15, 2020. *Works Department Report Received.*

## **Fire Department**

Dave Murphy, Fire Chief, was present and gave his report.

- a) Fire Calls There have been nine fire calls to date in 2020;
- b) Vehicles Fire department vehicles have all had their annual safety inspections. There was one issue with the turbo failing intermittently on the Dodge rescue vehicle that is stationed in Foymount. Staff will monitor the issue;
- c) SCBA's The SCBA's annual SCBA flow testing/fit testing has been completed;
- d) Ladder's The ladders are scheduled to undergo their annual testing later this week;
- e) Office of the Fire Marshall and Emergency Management The OFMEM advisor, Les Brinkworth will be attending the March 24<sup>th</sup> Council meeting for introduction to Council and presentation of certificates to two long standing fire staff;
- f) Dry Hydrants There is no suitable location for a dry hydrant in the Village of Eganville. The two other proposed locations for dry hydrants is at Lake Clear (near Opeongo Mountain Resort) and at the Constant Lake Bridge; and
- g) New Recruits Five new recruits have been hired and are starting the training process.
