The provincial declaration of emergency put in place on 2020-03-17 has been extended to 2020-04-13. b. A new emergency order has been issued to close all outdoor recreational amenities, such as sports fields and playgrounds, effective immediately. c. Refer to Appendix B for a list of emergency orders that are currently in effect. d. The following emergency orders have been extended until 2020-04-13:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Closure of public places and establishments with exemption for emergency child care for health care and frontline essential service workers ii. Prohibiting events and gatherings of more than five people iii. Enforcement of emergency orders iv. Work deployment for health service providers v. Work deployment for long-term care homes vi. Electronic service of documents vii. Electricity pricing viii. Drinking water and sewage ix. Closure of non-essential workplaces x. Prohibiting unconscionable pricing for necessary goods xi. Streamlining requirements for long-term care homes <p>Provincial Response:</p> <p>e. The province is taking action to ease the financial burden on students by temporarily deferring payments on OSAP loans until 2020-09-30. f. Public school closures have been extended until 2020-05-04. Private schools, licensed child care centres and EarlyON programs will also remain closed until 2020-04-13. This is due to the Declaration of Emergency which only allows closures to be extended for a 14 day period at a time. g. The province has launched a toll-free line to provide support to chiefs of police, police officers, and other enforcement personnel regarding the enforcement of emergency orders under the <i>Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act (EMCPA)</i>. The COVID-19 Enforcement Support Line has been established at 1-866-389-7638. Assistance is available Monday to Sunday, from 8:00 a.m. EST – 9:00 p.m. EST.</p> <p>To ensure the line can effectively respond to enforcement inquiries, it is requested that information associated with the Support Line not be disclosed to the general public.</p> <p>h. Office of the Chief Coroner announces postponement of inquests.</p> <p>Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PEOC) Response:</p> <p>i. The PEOC has updated the Question and Answer document to address common issues and inquiries across the province. j. The PEOC continues to transition to work fully virtually.</p>

m. The Government of Canada announced measures to support vulnerable Canadians experiencing health, social, and economic impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

a. The PEOC will continue to conduct coordination calls with federal, provincial and municipal stakeholders. Information shared in these calls will drive future planning efforts.			
b. The PEOC will continue to conduct contingency planning with key Indigenous partners as well as federal, provincial, municipal and other stakeholders in relation to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on flood and forest fire response.			
c. The PEOC will continue to coordinate information requirements from provincial and municipal partners.			
5. Anticipated Actions:			
a. The PEOC will maintain contact with federal, provincial and municipal stakeholders to monitor the situation.			
b. The PEOC will maintain situational awareness and is requesting the sharing of situation reports from partners.
