A provincial declaration of emergency on 2020-03-17 remains in effect. b. A provincial emergency order prohibiting unconscionable pricing for necessary goods <u>was issued</u>. The emergency order prohibiting public gatherings <u>was amended</u> to apply to public gatherings of over five people. It now applies to any social gatherings, public or private, of over five people, including religious services, with some exceptions. A provincial emergency order <u>was issued</u> to ensure that staffing and resources are available to help care for and protect long-term care residents during the COVID-19 crisis. The Ministry of Labour, Training, and Skills Development’s chief prevention officer <u>issued new guidance</u> on preventing the spread of COVID-19 in construction sites.</p> <p>Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PEOC) Response:</p> <p>g. The PEOC has updated the Question and Answer document to address common issues and inquiries across the province. h. The PEOC continues to transition to work fully virtually.</p> <p>Health sector response</p> <p>i. The Minister of Health issued an order under the Health Protection and Promotion Act requiring health care providers to provide information on their personal protective equipment supplies to the ministry. Specifics of the order have been distributed to the appropriate health care providers. j. Daily case reports, public materials and information sheets (in multiple languages) can be found by visiting Ontario.ca/coronavirus. More useful links can be found in Appendix C.</p> <p>Federal Response:</p> <p>k. As of midnight on 2020-03-25, all travellers returning to Canada will have to enter a mandatory 14-day self-isolation, following <u>an emergency order under the federal Quarantine Act</u>. There are exceptions for certain persons who cross the border regularly to ensure the continued flow of goods and services, and those who provide essential.</p>					
4. Future Outlook:					
a. The PEOC will continue to conduct coordination calls with federal, provincial and municipal stakeholders. Information shared in these calls will drive future planning efforts.					

b. The PEOC will conduct contingency planning with key Indigenous partners as well as federal, provincial, municipal and other stakeholders in relation to the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak on flood and forest fire response. c. The PEOC will coordinate information requirements from provincial and municipal partners.

a. The PEOC will maintain contact with federal, provincial and municipal stakeholders to monitor the situation. b. The PEOC will maintain situational awareness and is requesting the sharing of situation reports from partners.
