2. Support Resolution for Fire Departments - Resolution

WHEREAS the role of Ontario's 441 fire departments and their approximate 30,000 full, part-time, and volunteer firefighters is to protect Ontarians and their property; and

WHEREAS according to Emergency Management and the Ontario Fire Marshal's latest data, there were over 11,000 loss fires, 9,500 no loss fires, 784 injuries, 91 fatalities, and over \$820 million dollars of estimated loss in 2018; and

WHEREAS fire emergencies only make up a portion of the total calls for help received by fire and emergency service departments as they respond to nearly every public emergency, disaster, or 9-1-1 call; and

WHEREAS Ontario's fire department infrastructure deficit continues to grow annually and is almost entirely borne by the municipality and local taxpayers with the majority having populations under 25,000; and

WHEREAS due to antiquated structures and equipment that do not meet current industry standards the safety of the Ontario public and Ontario firefighters is being jeopardized;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Bonnechere Valley resolves as follows:

THAT the Federal and Provincial Government include apparatuses, training, equipment and structures for fire departments as eligible categories to any further infrastructure programs which will not only provide immediate stimulus to the local, provincial and federal economies given current economic uncertainty but also ensure the safety of Canadians and dedicated firefighters; and

THAT this resolution be forwarded to the Honourable Doug Ford Premier of Ontario, the Honourable Steve Clark, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Honourable Laurie Scott, Minister of Infrastructure, local MPP, local MP, the Ontario Fire Marshal, Jon Pegg, the Ontario Association of Fire Chiefs, ROMA, AMO, all Renfrew County Municipalities and the City of Pembroke.

3. Whitewater Region - Navigation on Ottawa River - Resolution

WHEREAS the federal government amended the Canada Shipping Act in 2018/2019 to give the Minister of Transportation broad powers over Canada's waterways; and

WHEREAS, in 2019 Minister Garneau issued orders shutting down the Ottawa River due to flooding with devastating impacts to the whitewater tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, whitewater tourism operators are skilled and know the Ottawa River; and **WHEREAS** the operators depend on early training during highwater; and

WHEREAS this supports the Township of Whitewater Region with the provision of boats and trained operators in emergency situations;

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Council of the Township of Bonnechere Valley call on Canada's Minister of Transportation to ensure whitewater tourism operators, including Wilderness Tours and Owl Rafting, are duly consulted prior to any and all navigational bans on the Ottawa River; and

FURTHER, that the whitewater rapids portion of the Ottawa River, in the area of Lot 28, Concession EFB (Westmeath) to Lot 14, Con 11 (Ross), from the top of McCoy Chute to the end of the fast water as the river flows into Rocher-Fendu Lake, be generally excluded from future interim orders and navigational bans; and

FURTHER that a copy of this resolution be provided to municipalities in Renfrew County, and the Pontiac along the Ottawa River as well as the Ottawa Valley Tourist Association.
