

ICITY ONLINE CITIZEN PORTAL

For online access to your property tax and water accounts, visit our website our website and click on iCity Online Citizen Portal. Instructions can be found on our website as well. Please Note: If you sign up for online access, your bills will not be printed or mailed.

PROPERTY TAXES

Two tax billings are mailed out per year. Each bill has two installments, making a total of four installments per year.

• Interim Bill (Installments One and Two)

KOJ 1TO

The Interim Bill is based on 50% of the previous year's total taxes. It is mailed at the beginning of March. The first installment is due at the end of March, and the second installment is due at the end of May.

• Final Bill (Installments Three and Four)

The Final Bill is based on the tax rate (set by Council) and your property assessment (set by MPAC). The Final Bill is mailed at the beginning of August. The third installment is due at the end of August, and the fourth installment is due at the end of October. Please Note: If MPAC adds assessment to your property or your property class changes, you may receive a Supplemental Bill.

UTILITIES BILLING

Each month, those on the Water and Sewer Systems will receive a Utilities Bill. The bill is based on the previous month's usage. The Administration Department receives the meter readings from the Water Department, then executes the billing. The meters are read on the first of every month. The base rate covers 0-17 cubic meters of water. If a household goes over 17 cubic meters, there is an additional charge per cubic meter. The rates and charges are set by Council annually.

HOW TO PAY PROPERTY TAXES & UTILITIES

Once you receive your bill, ensure you review the amounts owing and due dates. You are welcome to make payments on to your accounts at any point, however, ensure that amounts due are paid in full by the due date to avoid interest charges.

Payment Options:

• Online Banking Through Major Financial Institutions
To set the Township of Bonnechere Valley up as a payee, use the

search term "Bonnechere Valley" or "Township of Bonnechere Valley". Two options should show up, taxes and water. Select the appropriate option.

For taxes: Use your roll number as the account number, all 19 digits without any spaces or decimals.

For Utilities: Use your account number found on the bill, all 14 digitals without any spaces or decimals.

Then, follow your financial institutions instructions to complete the payment. Online bank payments typically take a few business days to process. To help avoid being charged interest, it is recommended that you make your payment a couple of business days before the due date. For any questions about making an online payment, contact your financial institution.

- Credit Card via PaySimply www.paysimply.ca
 It can take up to 10 business days for the Township to receive
 payments through PaySimply. If you would like to use this service,
 make your payment at least 10 business days before the due date to
 avoid being charged interest. PaySimply charges a fee for your use.
 Use the search term "Bonnechere Valley".
- At the Township Office (49 Bonnechere St. E, Eganville) We accept payments at the office during business hours via cash, cheque, or debit.

The Building Department also oversees civic addressing (911 signs), demolition permits, septic searches, and septic permits. BONNECHERE VALLEY FIRE RESCUE

The Township of Bonnechere Valley is served by a 911 emergency system. In the event of an emergency, residents should call 911 from a safe location and provide the requested information to the call center. If the emergency requires the fire service, dispatch will page fire fighters to respond.

The Bonnechere Valley Fire Department has an authorized limit of 40 firefighters and has two fire halls. The Eganville Hall is located at 49 Bonnechere St. E. Eganville, and the Sebastopol Hall is located 121 Janet Drive, Foymount.

OPEN AIR BURNS & BURN PERMITS

To conduct an open-air burn residents must obtain a burn permit online or from the township office. There is no cost to obtain the permit; however, failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the burn by-law can result in fines and/or charges. If you have questions about open air burns or campfires within the village, please contact the Fire Department.

The Water and Sewage Systems serve approximately 550 residential and commercial customers in the Village of Eganville. The Water and Sewage Department is responsible for the overall management, operation and maintenance of the systems.

WATER LEAKS

Water leaks can waste water 24/7 and cost you thousands of dollars each year. Many leaks occur in the bathroom with the main culprit often being the toilet. Toilet leaks are often silent. The graphic below indicates the importance of watching for leaks.

| Diameter of stream | n Gallons | Cubic Feet | Cubic Meter |

| 3/16" | 666,000 | 89,031 | 2,521 |
| 1/8" | 296,000 | 39,400 | 1,115 |
| 1 16" | 74,000 | 9,850 | 280 |
| 1/32" | 18,500 | 2,463 | 70 |

If your water bill is higher than normal, you may have a leak. Contact the Water Department for assistance.

Eganville Glacial's Erratic

"Dropped by a glacier thousands of years ago, this boulder is a glacial erratic. The rock type is a garnet gneiss. Garnets are scattered throughout, as well as faint foliation. The other minerals include feld spar and lesser amounts of mica /or sillimanite. It is a high pressure, high temperature metamorphic rock."
