## WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

There is NO OVERNIGHT PARKING allowed on any street or road in Bonnechere Valley between the hours of 12:00 AM to 7:00 AM from December 1st, 2024, to March 31, 2025. Vehicles found parked during that time will be ticketed or towed if interfering with municipal snow removal operations.

## REDUCED LOAD LIMITS

Pursuant to By-Law 2012-009, reduced load limits will be strictly enforced on all Bonnechere Valley Township roads (except for the Village of Eganville). Effective March 1, 2025, to May 31st inclusive, or later if conditions warrant. Vehicle loads will be restricted to 5 tonnes per axle on all Bonnechere Valley Township roads where appropriate signs have been erected. Questions? Call 613-628-3101 x 2855

## GRADING INFORMATION

Grading gravel roads is required to establish and maintain proper crown and aid in roadway drainage. Grading is used to prevent and repair washouts, potholes and washboards that may form. Granular roads are graded 4 times per year or more depending upon the impact that the weather and traffic has had upon the condition of the roadway. Early spring grading is light in nature to rid the road of the potholes. Late spring grading is to shape the road and prepare it for dust suppression and base stabilizing calcium chloride applications. Late summer grading and finally a fall grading will prepare the roads for winter travel. Shouldering involves building up gravel shoulder, with new materials, so they

meet the slope of the asphalt. It is performed on an as-needed basis in response to heavy runoff caused by

spring thaw or heavy precipitation and related washouts. Calcium Chloride is applied to freshly graveled roads and newly graded roads from May to June. This activity reduces the dust generated from traffic and helps maintain the graded shape of the road in the

## TAX ARREARS & TAX SALES

Tax Sales - If property taxes remain unpaid for a specific period of time, the Municipal Act provides for the sale of the property. The Township registers a Tax Arrears Certificate if taxes remain unpaid on vacant or improved land for three years prior to January 1 of any year. These timelines apply to both residential and non-residential classes of property.

Tax arrears certificate - A Tax Arrears Certificate indicates that the property will be sold if taxes, penalties, interest and reasonable costs incurred by the Township are not paid within one year of registration of the certificate. Once a certificate has been registered, partial payments cannot be

Sale of properties with unpaid taxes - The Township may advertise the property for sale for nonpayment of taxes if the cancellation price is not paid within one year of registration of the certificate. Buying a tax sale property - Using forms provided, the bid plus a certified cheque for 20 per cent of the tendered amount must be submitted in a sealed envelope prior to the specified time. To be eligible, bids must be at least equal to the advertised minimum tender amount. The successful purchasers will be required to pay the amount tendered plus accumulated taxes, penalties and interest, HST if applicable and the relevant land transfer tax. From the day of notification to the highest bidder, this eligible bidder has 14 calendar days to complete the transaction. All tax properties are sold without warranty and are sold as is. Further information will be made available at the time of advertising of the Tax Sale properties.
