## Waste Site Information

Beginning July 1, 2020 you will once again need to purchase garbage tags for curbside pickup and the green (dump) cards to visit any of our sites.

The Household Hazardous Waste Depot at Sand Road will be also be open on July 1st. The Depot will **ONLY** be open on Saturdays.



Included in with your final tax bill will be a "Waste Site Access Card". This card serves as your proof of residency and must be presented to the Waste Site Attendant upon each visit to our various sites.

## Reminder - Final Tax Bill Time

The final tax bill will be in the mail in August and will have installment due dates of August 31st, 2020 and October 30th, 2020.

Residents are encouraged to utilize online payment options. **Paying Your Taxes Online Through Your Banking Institution is easy if you following the set-up instructions.**


Tax and water bills can be paid online through your **online banking services**, through your financial institution.

To add the Township of Bonnechere Valley as a payee, use the search-term "Bonnechere Valley" and choose "Taxes" for property taxes or "Water" for Water Utility billing. Your account number is your roll number and it can be found on your bill.

**TAXES** - Use your full roll number (account number) starting with 4738 – use all 19 digits of your roll number without any dashes or decimals. Your roll number is located on the top left hand side of your tax bill.

***\*If you own multiple properties you must set up each one as a separate account. Otherwise your payments will not be allocated properly.***

**WATER** – Use your account number that is located on the top left hand side of your water bill – use all 14 digits of your account number – do not include any spaces.

If watching from your vehicles in town, please do not exit the vehicle to watch the display. However, if you do not have access to the internet or a vehicle, you may come to the bridge to watch them however you must not arrive prior to 9:30 pm. You must wear a mask and must physically distance. Staff will be on site monitoring the capacity on the bridge. If we reach our capacity we will need to turn people away.

Municipal Parking is available at the Eganville Arena, the parking lot beside Canada Post, at the Tourist Information Centre, lot across from the Freshmart and at the Library. Staff will again be on site requesting that you remain in your vehicles.

# MUNICIPAL AMENITIES - WHAT'S OPEN

To protect the health and safety of all residents, the Municipality has the following rules in place governing the use of our outdoor amenities. People must maintain a strict two-metre physical distance and obey the rules of use set out for the amenities. Bring your own hand sanitizer. Be safe!



Sports Fields (soccer, multi-use): Open for families. No team play or practice.



Baseball Diamonds: Open for families. No team play or practice.



Picnic Tables: Open. Physical distance. Bring your own hand sanitizer. No gatherings of more than ten people.



Tennis Courts: Open for singles play. Physical distance. Bring your own hand sanitizer.



Splash Pad: Open 10 am to 9 pm. No gatherings of more than ten people.



Beaches: Open. Physical Distance.



Boat Launches and Access Points: Open. Maintain social distancing.



Benches: Open. Physical Distance. Bring own hand sanitizer



Playgrounds: CLOSED
